

Assessment

Look inside your walls

- + Assess facility
- + Determine patron interest

Look outside your walls

+ Community mapping



Site Considerations

- + ADA accessible
- + Bright lighting
- + Comfortable seating
- + Clear sightlines
- + Climate controlled
- + Partner with another organization if needed



Artform Considerations

Visual Arts

- + Storage space
- + Table and chairs
- + Water source (if needed)

Literary Arts

+ Tables and chairs

Performing Arts

- + **Dance:** Large and supportive dance surface (no concrete) & chairs accessible
- + **Music:** Chairs and music stands
- Theater: Large enough space for movement

NOTE: MSUAL ARTS - programs with wet media (paint, clay, watercolors) require access to a water source.

DANCE/MOVEMENT - programs require clear, unencumbered space, with wooden flooring or linoleum tile over wood. (No concrete floors).

Assessment: Community Mapping

Things to consider:

- + What cultural resources or institutions are nearby?
 - Is there a museum, gallery, theater/music venue?
- + Do they offer programs specifically for older adults?
- + Is there a community arts center or music school?
- + Does your community have an arts council? Are they running programs for older adults?
- + Do other senior service organizations offer arts programs for their clients?

Community Resource Survey

Used to identify:

- Potential partners
- + Audiences
- + Funding
- + Teaching artists
- + Collaboration opportunities
- + Program overlap

Community Resource Survey

What to look for:

- . Venues: either space to run the program or to showcase the culminating event
- Potential audiences: organizations that serve your targeted population
- Promotional partners: organizations that already broadcast to older adults
- Funding: connect with organizations that can help tap into new funding streams
- Teaching artists: organizations that already contract, serve, or otherwise involve skilled arts instructors working with older adults in community
- Collaborative programming: organizations with built-in audiences and programs, but have gaps in their offerings
- Program overlap: do any of these organizations offer programming for older adults? If so, is it instructional arts programming?
